SATs

On Friday morning last week the Government announced some changes to the expectations for SATs for this academic year due to the ongoing pandemic.

The pupils in KS1 (Year 2) will not have to complete the tests this year and their assessments will be through teacher assessments. The pupils in KS2 (Year 6) will only have to complete the Reading and Mathematics papers. The SPAG will be teacher assessed this year and writing is always through teacher assessment.

Please, ensure you do not book a holiday week commencing 10th May 2021. The pupils who are self isolating will be able to take their test up to 10 days later.

The Y1 phonics screening test will still go ahead in June.
