We know everyone is fed up with hearing the word COVID but now is not the time to forget about it. If anything we must be extra careful and fully aware of the situation.

We are all aware that schools are a big topic in the news currently but I can assure you that while ever the Government and Local Authority say it is safe to open our doors our dedicated staff will continue to work and educate your children in school.

However, to ensure that can happen we all need to do our part in keeping everyone safe. So:

- If you or anyone in your • household has any of the main symptoms, please stay at home until you get your test results.
- Anyone testing positive, along with their whole household must isolate for 10 days.
- Anyone who has had close contact with a person who has tested positive should self isolate for 10 days from the last contact, before coming into the school grounds.
 - Everyone **MUST** remain socially distanced from other parents/carers that are not in their household. (Please be considerate to other peoples space.)
 - Please, follow the designated routes around school and be punctual for your child's class start and finish times.

School staff will continue to have a visual presence around the grounds to support and help as required.
